The Local Government Act 2020 requires Council to develop a Strategic Asset Management Plan to clearly and transparently set its direction and priorities which support the efficient and responsible management of its assets on behalf of the community.

The purpose of the plan is to provide an overview of Council's fixed assets, the strategic challenges it faces in responsible their management, and the longer term strategies Council is pursuing over the next decade.

Major assets maintained by Council include a road network of 5,302 kilometers and 240 buildings and structures with a replacement value of \$113M.
