Have Your Say – Draft Annual Budget 2023-24

Buloke Shire Council's Draft Annual Budget 2023-24 has been adopted for consultation and builds on recent budgetary successes whilst continuing to invest and ensure outcomes in the best interests of the community. Prepared in line with Council's Long-Term Community Vision, Council Plan 2021-2025, Revenue and Rating Strategy, and 10-year Financial Plan, the Draft Budget proposes a total capital works program of \$19.9M, including an estimated \$6.7M of projects being delivered over multiple years. Key initiatives such as the Wycheproof Wetlands, cabin accommodation projects and the Playspace Trail are highlights of the Draft Budget. Outside the flood recovery road program, a further \$5.5M is proposed to be invested into the Shire's Road network to ensure these critical assets continue to meet the needs of the community.
