Sale Yards Ramp Up

The Sale Yards at **Wycheproof** will receive a series of improvements over the coming months. Local Buloke contractors will construct shade structures for the protection of advanced animal tag reading equipment.

Regional Innovation

Expressions of Interest are now open for programs that will develop startup activity in regional centres, promote entrepreneurship and increase the number of early-stage ventures.

Programs currently funded by LaunchVic that operate in regional Victoria and are seeking re-funding and consortia proposals will also be considered.

The successful EOI applicants will be invited to submit a detailed Request for Proposal (RFP). Successful RFP applicants will receive funding of between \$50,000 and \$300,000 over 1-2 years. Funds can be used for operating costs.

Programs should champion regional innovation, consider the challenges and opportunities that exist for regional start-ups, and look at ways to build and stimulate the economies in local communities. EOI submissions close 10am, 21 July 2022.
