COVID Update

You have likely noticed that Community transmission of COVID is increasing across our community.

This is an expected part of the ongoing evolution of COVID in the community, as our immunity wanes with time and does not appear to be linked to a single new variant.

Now is a great time to remember that the best way to prevent those you love from getting infected is to protect yourself. If you don't get COVID, you can't spread COVID.

These 6 steps can help you stay ahead:

- 1. wearing a face mask if you have symptoms or in high-risk settings
- 2. staying up to date with your COVID vaccination
- 3. taking a test if you have symptoms
- 4. staying at home if sick
- 5. meeting outdoors or letting fresh air in when
- 6. talking to your GP about COVID medicines.

The Department of Health will continue to monitor surveillance indicators and keep the public informed of when COVID transmission returns to a low level of activity.

Asbestos Awareness Month

November marks the 10th Annual National Asbestos Awareness Month

Deadly asbestos remains hidden in one third of Aussie homes including brick, weatherboard, clad and fibro homes as well as apartments that were built or renovated prior to 1990. Asbestos can be found in many places around the home including under floor coverings, behind wall and floor tiles, in cement floors. internal and external walls, ceilings and ceiling space (insulation), eaves, garages, roofs, around hot water pipes, fences, home extensions, garages, outdoor toilets, backyard and farm structures, chook sheds and even dog kennels.

Over 4,000 Australians die every year from asbestosrelated diseases and with the popularity of renovating on the rise, more homeowners are taking unnecessary risks with asbestos, jeopardising their health and the health of their families when doing DIY renovations.

Buloke Shire Council is committed to educating our community about the dangers of asbestos and encouraging them to learn how to manage asbestos
