As recently announced, Council has been successful in receiving \$300,000 from Regional Development Victoria for renovations to the Sea Lake Office and conversion to a visitor information centre.

During these renovations, Council will work Advance Sea Lake and other community stakeholders and tourism bodies on how the proposed centre will be run through a volunteer model that best suits the community and travellers.

It's an exciting time for the burgeoning tourism area that is Sea Lake and surrounds.

Meanwhile it has been established that Lake Tyrrell is open to visitation with the eased restrictions now in place.

Baileys Road and some parts of the lake are still closed due to construction works as part of the Lake Tyrrell Tourism Infrastructure Project.

Access to Lake Tyrrell is via Saltworks Road.
